Town-Wide Population Forecasts and Distribution to 2031

The Town of Caledon Official Plan sets out a population forecast for Caledon to the year 2021 and population allocations for the various communities within the Town. The Council of the Town of Caledon has initiated a study that will extend the population forecast for the Town as a whole to the year 2031. This work is being undertaken as part of the South Albion-Bolton Community Plan.

The South Albion-Bolton Community Plan will provide direction for that community's residential, commercial and industrial growth within the 2031 planning horizon. The process of developing a population allocation for South Albion – Bolton includes the development of a 2031 population forecast for the Town of Caledon and consideration of the distribution of the population growth within the Town. A Community Meeting was held in Bolton on June 27, 2005 to discuss the population forecasts and land use options that had been developed in the first two phases of the South Albion-Bolton Community Plan.

The purpose of this Community Meeting on September 19, 2005 is to present additional population information and issues and provide the residents and stakeholders everywhere in the Town with an opportunity to view and discuss the options for population forecasting and distribution.

The meeting will:

- Provide information on the Provincial, Regional and Caledon context for population forecasting
- Review potential population growth and distribution scenarios
- Provide an opportunity for discussion and comment by residents and stakeholders
