## CALEDON'S WALK OF FAME ANNOUNCES TAYLER PARNABY AS THE 2011 INDUCTEE

Over the years, Parnaby has received numerous awards including the *President's Award* by the Canadian Radio and Television News Directors Association, the 1999 *Sam Ross Award* for editorial commentary, two *Canadian Association of Broadcasters' Gold Medals* for excellence in broadcasting, Caledon's 2007 principal award for volunteer services and the 2009 Charles Sourial Greenspace Award for service in environmental causes.

The community is invited to join Mayor Marolyn Morrison in the unveiling of the Parnaby stone. Following the ceremony, residents are invited to join the Caledon Hills Bruce Trail Club on a guided trail walk focusing on the history of the railways in Caledon.

The Trans Canada Trail Pavilion Park is located on the west side of Airport Road in Caledon East, just south of Emma Street and Old Church Road. There is parking available on Emma Street and east on Old Church Road at Caledon East Park; a five minute walk down the Trailway.
