“On behalf of Council and this community, I am pleased to congratulate you on your LEED Certification, and thank you for participating in the Town’s Green Development Program,” said Mayor Marolyn Morrison. “The Prologis Park development is truly a showcase example for future Green Development Program participants.”

Prologis Park Bolton consists of a single 416,000-square-foot distribution center located on approximately 22 acres near the intersection of Highway 50 and Mayfield Road in Caledon. The facility incorporates a number of sustainable design and construction techniques, including extensive use of recycled and locally sourced construction materials and the installation of an energy-efficient fluorescent lighting system.

“Prologis has a long standing commitment to the principles of sustainability. Prologis Park Bolton was completed in partnership with the Town of Caledon’s Green Development Program, which enabled us to pursue a higher level of LEED certification, helping to secure two long-term leases that occupy the entire facility.” said Jeffrey Miller, Prologis’ investment officer for the Toronto market.

"This is an excellent example of a municipality and developer working together to achieve maximum results," noted Miller.
