Now therefore be it resolved that additional paving work on private driveways in Antrim Court Phase 2, in the estimated amount of \$50,000, be approved

That capital project 17-167 be increased by \$50,000 to be recovered from the developer in the future;

That the General Manager, Finance and Infrastructure Services/Chief Financial Officer be authorized to execute agreements with private property owners in Antrim Court Phase 2 to limit the Town's liability for the work including clarification that the Town has no liability for future maintenance, repair, and replacement.

Whereas the omission of Bolton Commuter GO Rail Service within the term of the Draft 2041 Regional Transportation Plan period is detrimental to the objectives of the Town's transit-supportive planned growth in Bolton community;

Now therefore be it resolved that the Town requests that Metrolinx include the interim, peak period train service on the Commuter Rail Service to Bolton project as a 'priority project' while finalizing the Draft 2041-Regional Transportation Plan;

That Metrolinx be requested to take immediate steps to advance planning and protection on the rail corridor to introduce rail service to Bolton;

That Metrolinx be requested to provide more details respecting the timelines and modalities for the provision of transit service to Mayfield West Community to ensure that the terminus is consistent with the Town's Mayfield West Phase 2 Transportation Master Plan.
