# Independent Auditor's Report with respect to Municipal Elections Act, 1996 (Section 78)

### To: Clerk, Town of Caledon

We have audited the Statement of Assets and Liabilities, the Statement of Campaign Period Income and Expenses, and the Statement of Determination of Surplus and Disposition of Surplus of Jennifer Innis, candidate, for the campaign period from June 13, 2018 to December 31, 2018 relating to the election held on October 22, 2018. This financial information has been prepared by management in accordance with accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

# Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Information

The candidate is responsible for the preparation of the schedules in accordance with the accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, and for such internal control as the candidate determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial information that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on this financial information based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial information is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial information. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of those risks of material misstatement of the financial information, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the candidate's preparation of the financial information in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by Jennifer Innis, candidate, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial information.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

#### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in an election campaign, it is impracticable through auditing procedures to determine that the accounting records include all the donations of goods and services, and receipts and disbursements. Accordingly, our verification of these transactions was limited to ensuring that the financial information reflects the amounts recorded in the accounting records of Jennifer Innis, candidate, and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income and expenses, assets or liabilities, and surplus/deficit.

# **Qualified Opinion**

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial information presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the candidate's election campaign as at December 31, 2018 and the income and expenses for the campaign period from June 13, 2018 to December 31, 2018 and the determination of surplus or deficit and the disposition of surplus in accordance with accounting treatment prescribed by the Municipal Elections Act, 1996.

## Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to the basis of accounting. The Municipal Elections Act, 1996 does not require us to report, nor was it practicable for us to determine, that contributions reported include only those which may be properly retained in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996. This financial information, which has not been, and was not intended to be, prepared in accordance with Canadian Generally accepted accounting principles is solely for the information and use of Clerk, Town of Caledon, for complying with the Municipal Elections Act, 1996. This financial information is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than the specified user or for any other purpose.
