

PROCLAMATION

Emancipation Day

Whereas, On this day, August 1st, 1834, slavery was abolished throughout British Colonies

by King William IV pursuant to the Slavery Abolition Act of 1833; and

Whereas, Within fifteen years of the abolition of slavery, between 35,000 and 40,000 Black

settlers made their way to Ontario in large part to the Underground Railway to

Southwestern Ontario; and

Whereas, This day is an opportunity to recognize Canadians are not always aware that Black

and Indigenous Peoples were once enslaved on the land that is now Canada; and

Whereas, As a demonstration of our respect for human liberty and freedom and in recognition

of the richness of the culture and history brought to Ontario by African Canadians;

and

Whereas, To commend the individuals who fought enslavement, understanding they were

pivotal in shaping our society to be as diverse as it is today; and

Whereas, Emancipation Day acts as a reminder to maintain meaningful dialogue surrounding

race relations and inclusiveness;

Now, Therefore, I, Allan Thompson, Mayor of the Town of Caledon, do hereby proclaim
