Whereas,	The Town of Caledon also recognizes this date as "Orange Shirt Day" to remember and reflect upon the history and ongoing legacy and trauma that resulted from Canada's residential and day school system; and
Whereas,	We honour the bravery and resilience of residential school survivors, their families, and their Communities; and
