The \$257 million (M) budget comprises an \$89M capital budget and \$168M operating budget:

This increase will support the Town's operating costs and ensure essential services

Property Tax Increase:

and ensure essential services continue to be provided to residents and businesses.

Annual Infrastructure Levy Increase:

Dedicated funding for critical infrastructure projects to maintain and enhance safety and increase mobility.

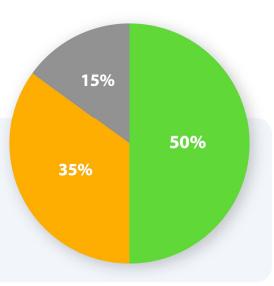

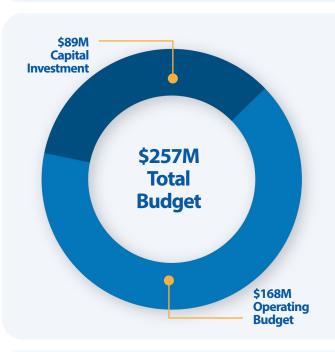


BUDGET AT A GLANCE

How your tax dollar is spent

For every \$1 in property tax collected, 50¢ stays with the Town of Caledon. The remainder goes to Peel Region and local school boards.





2026 budget allocation

The 2026 budget is designed to address the challenges of Caledon's growth forecast while maintaining essential services and critical infrastructure. Totaling \$257 million, the budget consists of an \$168 million operating budget and an \$89 million capital investment.

This budget strategically supports growth by prioritizing investments to strengthen services and position Caledon for long-term success.
