## Caledon Council Golf Tournament Helps Fund Supportive Housing Project

The <u>Caledon Council Community Golf Tournament</u> (CCCGT) is pleased to announce that <u>Raising the Roof</u>, the primary recipient of its funding for 2018, will receive \$64,002 towards the renovation of a heritage home for use as supportive housing for adults living with intellectual or developmental disabilities.

The property being renovated is located at 1 Cedar Mains Drive in Caledon. A heritage property near Highway 50 and Old Church Road, the building is known locally as "the Church House."

Once renovated, the property – located on Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) lands – will be turned over to Caledon Housing Initiative (CHI), a local parent organization that helps support families and their family members with intellectual or developmental disabilities.

At a ceremony prior to its Council meeting yesterday, Mayor Allan Thompson, Caledon Council members and representatives of Raising the Roof, CHI and TRCA participated in a cheque presentation at Caledon Town Hall.
