

Widening of McLaughlin Road, Construction of new East-West Spine Road and Modifications to Highway 410/Hurontario Street Interchange

THE STUDY

The Town of Caledon has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment study to accommodate planned growth within the Mayfield West Phase 2 development, to (i) widen McLaughlin Road from Mayfield Road northerly approximately 1700 metres; (ii) construct a new east-west Spine Road from Hurontario Street to Chinguacousy Road, and (iii) modify the Highway 410 interchange at Hurontario Street/Valleywood Boulevard.

THE PROCESS

The study followed 'Schedule C' of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process described in the Municipal Engineers Association guide (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), in accordance with the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The process included consultation with the public, stakeholders and review agencies through out the study. A Public Information Centre was held on July 5, 2018.

PUBLIC REVIEW PERIOD

An Environmental Study Report (ESR) has been prepared, which details the planning, design and decision-making process, how public and agency input was addressed, and the preferred alternative, along with associated mitigation measures to address impacts, and next steps towards project implementation. The ESR will be available for a 30-day review period, starting from June 20, 2019 and ending on July 22, 2019 at 4:30 pm, on the town website and at the following locations:

Anyone with an interest in the study is encouraged to review the ESR and provide comments to the Town of Caledon during the designated review period. If concerns arise during the 30-day review period which cannot be resolved through discussions with the Town of Caledon/Consultants, a person may request that the Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (a Part II order). This request must be received within the above noted 30-day timeline ending on July 22, 2019 at 4:30 p.m., by the Minister, at the address listed below, and copied to Kant Chawla, the Town of Caledon Project Manager. If no request is received, subject to the receipt of necessary approvals, the Town intends to proceed with the project implementation phase.
