The Study

In response to continued population growth and increased wear and tear on existing infrastructure through increased traffic, development, new infrastructure, and increased expectations as to the type and quality of services the Town provides, the Town of Caledon has identified the need for improvements to Glasgow Road, from Chickadee Lane to Deer Valley Drive. Through subsequent review of the original study area and discussions with the Town, the study area and limits of the preliminary design have been extended to include an additional 300 m of Deer Valley Drive, from Glasgow Road to Bambi Trail, to address a missing link in the Town's active transportation network. The active transportation facility will provide better pedestrian and cyclist connectivity, enhance bicvcle and pedestrian travel, and ultimately improve livability in communities.




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

Preferred Alternative Solution

Through consultation with Agencies, Members of the Public, and Indigenous Communities, the preferred solution for the rehabilitation Glasgow Road is to maintain current rural roadway cross-section with addition of Active Transportation Facility (MUP) on one side. Rehabilitation of the Glasgow Road segment including pavement structure, shoulders, improved ditching and widening to accommodate a multi-use path on one side of the roadway, as well as providing a link to a new facility on one side of Deer Valley Drive.
