THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF CALEDON

BY-LAW NO. 95-67

A by-law to regulate nuisances resulting from noise

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon has passed a by-law to control noise pursuant to the *Environmental Protection Act*, and

WHEREAS the provisions of that by-law are not sufficient to prohibit or regulate all noises within the municipality; and

WHEREAS section 210, paragraphs 138 and 140 of the *Municipal Act (R.S.O. 1990, Chap. M.45)*, provide that the Council of a local municipality may pass a by-law for prohibiting or regulating the ringing of bells, the blowing of horns, shouting and unusual noises, or noises likely to disturb the inhabitants and for prohibiting and abating public nuisances;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. No person shall in the Town of Caledon create, cause, emit or permit to be created or emitted, any shouting, unusual noises, or noises likely to disturb the inhabitants.
2. For the purpose of this by-law, and without limiting the generality of section 1, the following noises shall be deemed to be unusual noises or noises likely to disturb the inhabitants:
 - (1) the sound or noise from, or created by any radio, phonograph, television, public address system, sound equipment, loud speaker, or similar device or devices, or any musical or sound-producing instrument of whatever kind when such device or instrument is played or operated, and
 - (2) crying, yelling, hooting, shouting or loud speaking in, or adjacent to any public street or place, or in or on a private place,

where such noise or sounds are of such volume as to likely annoy or disturb the peace, quiet, comfort or repose of any person in any dwelling house, apartment house, hotel or any other form of residence.

3. Subject to the provisions of sections 7 and 8 of By-law 86-110, in the event of conflict between the provisions of this by-law and any other by-law in respect of noise, the provisions of this by-law shall prevail.
4. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence.
